Miriam & Em Mozes

If you were asked to give the meaning of the word: "forgiveness", what would your definition be? In the Bible, the Greek word "forgiveness" means to "let go". Other meanings are the action or the process of forgiving or being forgiven. Sojourner members are now much more aware of the word and its meaning.

The group has been viewing the DVD called "Forgiving Dr. Mengele", a documentary about Eva Mozes Kor, and her twin sister, Miriam, both Holocaust survivors. The girls were subjected to human experimentation under Dr. Josef Mengele, often called the Angel of Death, at Auschwitz.

Eva and Miriam Mozes were born in Port, Romania in 1934, the Mozes family its only Jewish residents. In 1940 Hungarian Nazis occupied the village and the family was moved to the ghetto; in 1944 they were transported to Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp where both parents and two sisters died.





Eva and her twin were in a group of children used in the experiments under the direction of Dr. Mengele. Approximately

1,500 sets of twins were subjected to medical treatments. On January 27, 1945 when the Soviet Army liberated the camp, they found only 180 children had survived; Eva and Miriam, two of the survivors.

The Choir rehearses on Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm and new members are always welcome – no auditions required.






In April of 2015 Eva traveled to Germany to testify at the trial of Nazis Oskar Groning, now 93 years of age. There Eva publicly forgave Groning when he testified as to what had happened at Auschwitz 70 years earlier. This public forgiveness received international attention. That story is told in the documentary.

Eva married one of the Holocaust survivors and in 1965 became a United States citizen. The couple had two children. Eva became a lecturer and returned to Germany numerous times. She diligently worked with U.S. state legislators to pass laws requiring that Holocaust education be taught in secondary schools.



CANDLES, a museum in Terra Haute, Indiana, was founded by Eva to educate the public about eugenics, the Holocaust, and the power of forgiveness.
